41:06:05:01. Archery equipment restrictions. A person hunting with bow and arrow may not use or possess any of the following:

- (1) Explosive, poisonous, hydraulic, or pneumatic points;
- (2) ~~Barbed points except for taking fish and frogs;~~
- (3) (2) Crossbows and draw-lock devices that hold the bow at partial or full draw except as provided in chapter 41:09:12;
- (4) ~~Bolts or darts;~~

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~~(5)~~ (3) Arrow rests that have more than three inches of continuous contact with the arrow;

~~(6)~~ (4) Electronic devices mounted to the bow that aid in the taking of game. However, cameras, video cameras, cell phones used exclusively for photographic purposes, lighted sight pins, and illuminated arrow nocks may be used;

~~(7)~~ (5) Electronic arrow or electronic string releases;

~~(8)~~ (6) Compound bows with a let off of more than 80 percent;

~~(9)~~ (7) Compound bows shorter than 28 inches as measured from ~~axle to axle~~ the top of the upper wheel or cam to the bottom of the lower wheel or cam;

~~(10)~~ Mechanical broadheads while hunting elk;

~~(11)~~ Mechanical broadheads with a cutting diameter greater than two inches; or

~~(12)~~ (8) Telescopic sights and ~~electronically lighted sight pins;~~

(9) An arrow, including the attached broadhead, weighing less than 275 grains when hunting a big game animal;

(10) An arrow that is less than 26 inches long when measured from the notch of the nock to the end of the shaft, not including the blunt or broadhead;

(11) An arrow without a broadhead (fixed or mechanical) that has at least two metal cutting edges when hunting a big game animal, except blunt points may be possessed and used when hunting a turkey and both field points and blunt points may be possessed and used when hunting small game or at any time when possessed and used as practice arrows; or

(12) A bow that measures less than 50 pounds pull when hunting an elk with a mechanical broadhead or a bow that measures less than 40 pounds pull when hunting any other big game animal with a mechanical broadhead;

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(13) A bow that measures less than 40 pounds pull when hunting an elk with a fixed blade broadhead or a bow that measures less than 30 pounds pull when hunting any other big game animal with a fixed blade broadhead.

41:06:05:02. Minimum size of bow and arrows. ~~Big game licensees hunting with bow and arrow shall be equipped with a bow of not less than 40 pounds pull. The broadheads shall be of metal, have a cutting diameter of at least 7/8 inch wide, have at least two cutting edges, and except for turkey hunting shall be at least as long as it is wide. An arrow and attached broadhead shall weigh at least 275 grains when used for hunting big game animals. Blunt points at least 9/16 inch wide may be used for hunting turkeys. The arrow measured from the notch of the nock to the end of the shaft not including the tip or broadhead may not be less than 26 inches long.~~ Repealed.

41:06:16:07. Goose hunting season, Conservation Order, and August Management Take established -- Shooting hours -- Exceptions -- Open units --

Closed areas. The light goose hunting season is open statewide for 86 consecutive days beginning on the last Saturday of September. A Conservation Order is open statewide for 79 consecutive days beginning on the 106th day from the Saturday closest to November 1. Only light geese, as defined in § 41:06:16:06.01, may be taken during a Conservation Order. As used in this article, a Conservation Order is a Congressional Order which amends the Fish and Wildlife Service regulations based on a 1999 Congressional action (Pub. L. No. 106-108,) effectively reinstating regulations intended to reduce the population of mid-continent light geese (MCLG). The law authorizes the use of additional hunting methods (electronic calls and unplugged guns) to increase the take of MCLG. As a result, a Conservation Order for the reduction of the MCLG population was authorized.

Additionally, an August Management Take for the taking of Canada geese is open to South Dakota residents beginning on the ~~first~~ third Saturday of August to August 31, inclusive, in the counties of Brookings, Brown, Clark, Codington, Day, Deuel, Hamlin, Hanson, Hutchinson, Grant, Kingsbury, Lake, Lincoln, McCook, Marshall, Minnehaha, Miner, Moody, Pennington west of the Cheyenne River, Roberts, Spink, Turner, and Union.

The white-fronted goose season is open statewide for 72 consecutive days beginning on the last Saturday of September.

The dark goose season is open statewide as specifically provided for in this section and the special Canada goose hunting units in § 41:06:16:08:

(1) Unit 1: the counties of Aurora, Beadle, Brookings, Brown, Butte, Campbell, Clark, Clay, Codington, Corson, Davison, Day, Deuel, Douglas, Edmunds, Faulk, Grant, Haakon, Hamlin, Hand, Hanson, Harding, Hutchinson, Jackson, Jerauld, Jones, Kingsbury, Lake, Lawrence, Lincoln, McCook, McPherson, Marshall, Meade, Mellette, Minnehaha, Moody, Miner, Pennington, Roberts, Sanborn, Shannon, Spink, Todd,

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Turner, Union, Walworth, Yankton, and Ziebach, that portion of Dewey County north of Bureau of Indian Affairs Road 8, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Road 9, and the section of U.S. Highway 212 east of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Road 8 junction, that portion of Potter County east of U.S. Highway 83, that portion of Sully County east of U.S. Highway 83, portions of Hyde, Buffalo, Brule, Charles Mix, and Bon Homme counties north and east of a line beginning at the Hughes-Hyde county line on State Highway 34, east to Lees Boulevard, southeast to the State Highway 34, east 7 miles to 350th Avenue, south to Interstate 90 on 350th Avenue, south and east on State Highway 50 to Geddes, east on 285th Street to U.S. Highway 281, north on U.S. Highway 281 to the Charles Mix-Douglas county boundary, the portion of Bon Homme County north of State Highway 50, that portion of Fall River County west of State Highway 71 and U.S. Highway 385, and that portion of Custer County west of State Highway 79 and north of French Creek. The season is open for 107 consecutive days, less the number of days set aside for the Early Fall Canada Goose season as established in chapter 41:06:50 beginning October 1;

(2) Unit 2: those portions of the state not described in Unit 1 and Unit 3. The season is open for 105 consecutive days beginning on the Saturday closest to November 1;

(3) Unit 3: Bennett County. The season is open for nine consecutive days beginning on the second Saturday of January.

Except for the light goose Conservation Order, shooting hours for geese are one-half hour before sunrise to sunset daily. The shooting hours for the light goose Conservation Order are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset daily.

Special deer licenses—~~Submission of tooth envelope—Report card—License restriction.~~ Special deer licenses valid November 1 to November 30, inclusive, are available by lottery to residents. (3) Unit BHD-BD3: those portions of Lawrence, Meade, and Pennington Counties enclosed by a line beginning at the junction of U.S. Highway 385 and U.S. Highway 85 at Lead, then northeasterly along U.S. Highway 85 to its junction with U.S. Alternate Highway 14, then easterly along U.S. Alternate Highway 14 to its junction with Interstate 90 at Sturgis, then southeasterly along Interstate 90 to its junction with U.S. Highway 16 at Rapid City, then southwesterly along U.S. Highway 16 to its junction with U.S. Highway 385, then northerly along U.S. Highway 385 to its junction with U.S. Highway 85, the point of beginning; no "antlerless whitetail deer" licenses;

All traps shall be rendered inoperable and all snares shall be closed to their permanent stop, or closed to less than two and one-half inches if the snare is not equipped with a permanent stop, if the person responsible for checking the traps or snares is not actively trapping and checking them within the time frames as provided in § 41:08:02:03. All traps and snares (set or unset), stakes, cables, chains, wires, or other devices used for the purpose of attaching a trap or snare shall be removed from public lands and improved road rights-of-way prior to May 1 of each year.
